Guidelines for UCSB Applicants Campus Application Deadline is November 28, 2007

The Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, one of the world's leading think tanks specializing in international affairs, conducts programs in research, discussion, publication, and education in international relations and U.S. foreign policy. The Junior Fellows Program is designed to provide a substantive work experience for students who have a serious career interest in the area of international affairs. Each year the Endowment offers 8-10 one-year fellowships to uniquely qualified graduating seniors and individuals who have graduated during the past academic year. They are selected from a pool of nominees from close to 300 colleges. Carnegie Junior Fellows work as research assistants to the Endowment's senior associates. We are unable to consider anyone who has started graduate studies. Applicants for the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace Junior Fellows Program must be nominated by their undergraduate institution. The Endowment will not accept application material directly from the student. Application Deadline: November 28, 2007 (no exceptions)

Application materials are NOT available online. Please contact the URCA Office, 2105 North Hall for application form and essay topics. (Available approximately October 1, 2007.)

Please submit the following materials:

- Completed application form (available from the URCA Office in the fall)
- Essay (one page or less) on why you would like to become a junior fellow
- One to two-page resume
- Two letters of recommendation (at least one must be from a professor in your major department)
- Transcripts from all colleges and universities you have attended (may be unofficial)
- An essay of no more than three typewritten, double-spaced pages on one of the topics provided by the Carnegie Endowment (available from the URCA Office). These topics are not necessarily indicative of the issues that Junior Fellows will research at the Carnegie Endowment, but they are intended to test skills in analysis, logic, and written expression. The essays should be thought pieces (*similar to opinion editorials*), NOT research papers.

All application materials and letters of recommendation must be submitted to the URCA Office, North Hall 2105, by 4:00 p.m. on **November 28, 2007**. Please inform the writers of your letters of recommendation of this deadline and provide them with the following mailing address:
