

Jack Kent Cooke Scholarship

Guidelines for UCSB Applicants

Campus Deadline is February 3, 2010

The Jack Kent Cooke Graduate Scholarships are awarded annually to outstanding students from across the nation. Institutions may nominate up to two seniors or alumni who have graduated since May, 2005. The awards provide funding for tuition, room and board, required fees, and books up to \$50,000 annually for a maximum of six years. Scholarship length and amounts will vary for each recipient based on several factors, including costs to the institution he or she attends and the degree sought. Scholars may use the award to attend any accredited graduate school in the U.S. or abroad in pursuit of a graduate or professional degree including medicine, law, or business.

Conditions of Eligibility:

- Be a senior or recent graduate (Since May, 2005)
- Have a cumulative college grade point average of 3.5 or better on a 4.0 scale (or the equivalent)
- To begin his/her first graduate degree program at an accredited college or university in the fall of 2010

*Please note: only students with exemplary academic records (GPA > 3.8) and substantive evidence of aptitude for their desired graduate programs will be competitive.

Please adhere to the directions outlined in the "2010 Bulletin of Information". In addition to the completion of the online application, applicants must submit the following for campus review:

- The Financial Information forms, signed by applicant and both parents, no exceptions (upload forms onto the on-line application)
- Official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended (must include F'09 grades)
- Two letters of recommendation – you must secure these in time for the campus review. Please inform the writers of your letters that the campus deadline is February 3, 2010. The letters should be submitted on-line or drafts of the letters may be mailed directly to the URCA Coordinator at the address listed below.
